#### THE LOVE THAT NEVER FAILS

An unknown author described God's love as a stream that never freezes, a fountain that never runs dry, and a sun that never sets. Failure to recognize the unchanging love of God has driven many people to despair.

Dwight L Moody an evangelist and publisher once commented, "I know of no truth in the whole Bible that ought to come home to us with such power and tenderness as that of the love of God. Satan constantly tries to persuade men and women that the Lord does not love them. He succeeded in making our first parents believe that lie, and too often he succeeds with us."

Moody continued, "Because your child is fretful or has committed some act of disobedience, you do not cast him out as though he did not belong to you. So too, when we go astray, it does not follow that God despises us. It's the sin that He hates." Moody was trying to say that God hates anything that we do that is wrong, but God does not Hate us instead he loves us with an everlasting Love.

This is the love that the prophet Jeremiah wrote to Israel about an everlasting love of God that is just as true for His people today as it was for the Israelites. Our God is a God of compassion who never disappoints us.

Let us remember that no matter how unsettling our circumstances may be life is worth living when we take God's reassuring words to heart: "I have loved you, my people, with an everlasting love. With unfailing love I have drawn you to myself." Jeremiah 31:3

How wonderful to know that He Who watches from above, Will always keep us sheltered in His ever-present love.

So in the uncertain times that lie ahead let us remember that the Love offered by people may have limits but the love freely given by God's is limitless.

The Christian festival of Easter and Pentecost are a reminder of Gods undying and untiring love for us. A love that never fails and is one on which we can count on. Remember the words of the psalmist in psalm 121 who says:-

I look up to the mountains—does my help come from there?
 My help comes from the LORD, who made heaven and earth!

#### Name, please

I've been thinking. About names, and surnames in particular. It began a few Sundays ago when there was a moment of misunderstanding about the Bible readings. They were from "John". Now there are several New Testament books by John: the Gospel, Letters 1, 2 and 3, and the Revelation - the future as revealed to John.

A little research about the identity of this (or these) authors showed that not all Biblical scholars agree on the matter, having examined and analysed the content, style and language of these 5 books. But most agree that the Gospel writer was probably one of the disciples, son of Zebedee and brother of James.

As to the Letters, the first is similar in style and ideas to the Gospel. It begins in a way similar to the Gospel's opening "We write (to you) about the Word of life..." (Letter) "Before the world was created the Word already existed" (Gospel). Letter 2 on the other hand, begins more like a Letter than an essay - "To the dear Lady and her children" (probably a particular church leader and her congregation). Letter 3, likewise, is to a particular person, starting with "To my dear Gaius, whom I truly love."

What about the author of Revelation? On the basis of literary style and emphasis, it is unlikely that this John wrote either Gospel or Letters. What is certain is that the other John of the New Testament, John the Baptist, forerunner of Jesus, left no recorded written work.

My own conclusion in all of this is that much of the uncertainty would have been avoided if there had been some SURNAMES, which is where my thoughts then turned. No surnames in Bible times, nor in ancient Greece or Rome or Egypt, just Plato, Brutus, Tutankhamen, Abraham, Noah. So when and where did they come into use? Who created them? How were they invented?

Think of the kinds of surname - colours for example: White, Black, Grey, Green, Brown, but no Orange, Turquoise or Pink (although I believe there was a footballer named Violet, and Rabbi Lionel Blue used to tell good tales on "Thought for the Day" on Radio 4). Many surnames reflect families: Rogerson, Robinson, Benson, Gilbertson and so on - rather male-orientated it seems. Or place-names. Is that where the family originated? Plenty of local examples - Kirkham, Preston, Garstang, Newton, Clifton, Ramsbottom, etc., but I didn't ever come across a Mrs Blackpool or a Mr Oswaldtwistle. There is, however, a little place called Wolstenholme near Rochdale, Womersley in Yorkshire and, further afield, Durham, and Yaxleys in Cambridgeshire and Suffolk. What about the

occupations which became surnames, presumably to identify them in growing communities: Butcher, Baker, Glazier, Shepherd, Farmer, Carter, Cartwright, Carpenter, and I recall an Indian cricketer named Engineer.

Some quite ordinary things get into the surname list - Ball, Bell, Hall, Seed, Frost, Snow. Royalty and aristocracy are in there as well, with King and Prince, Knight and Lord. Thinking back over my working life, I had colleagues called Fish, Haddock, Duck, Lion, Bull and Plank. From the countryside we have Hill, Heath, Wood, Field, Fountain, Forest, Lamb, Fox.

If like me, you sometimes find that sleep eludes you, try choosing a letter and a category and see how many surnames you can come up with. Still awake? Choose another letter. Not asleep yet? Just go downstairs and make yourself a cup of hot chocolate and a slice of toast!


### Messy Church on Friday 15th June 2018 5 - 7pm
