District Spotlight: Meet Jack Watson

My name is Jack Watson, and this photograph of me was taken on my 30th birthday this January. Reflecting on the start of my 20s, I could never have imagined that the final day of that decade would find me addressing all the superintendents in the district.

My professional journey began in teaching, I have a PGCE in Primary Education. I spent a couple of years as a primary school teacher. Later, I became a children's worker with the Wirral Methodist Circuit. In 2021, I became the Circuit Safeguarding Officer (CSO) for Wirral. By 2022, I had taken on the CSO role for Southport, and in 2023, for the newly formed North Liverpool and South Sefton Circuit. In 2024, I became District Safeguarding Officer for the new North West District, covering the Lancashire Misson Area and supporting Helen with the Greater Manchester Plus Mission Area. I am currently doing an MSc in Safeguarding at Birmingham City University

Beyond Methodist safeguarding, I work as a safeguarding advisor, providing guidance and training to local charities and companies. Additionally, I collaborate with local councils on cases involving children's and adults' services. I also serve as Vice-Chair of Governors for a local Alternative Provision and recently became a trustee for a charity.



My connection to the church began as a child at Christ Church, Bootle. At the age of nine, I auditioned for Liverpool Cathedral Choir, and have spent the last 20 years singing in the choir, became head chorister, and then a deputy lay clerk, and am a member of the choristers guild, and was secretary to the guild, and now volunteer with the choir by teaching probationers—a role that brings me great joy as I once stood where they are now.



In my spare time, I enjoy organizing and performing in concerts, I have a music degree from Liverpool Hope University. Recently, I performed the music of Harold Arlen at Liverpool Cathedral and St. Mark's Methodist Church, as well as a concert titled *These You Have Loved* in Aughton, Formby Methodist Church, and Biddulph Methodist Church as part of the Biddulph Festival. Currently, I'm preparing a concert of Stephen Sondheim's music, which I hope to perform in May 2025.
